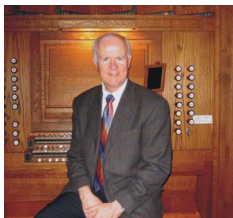

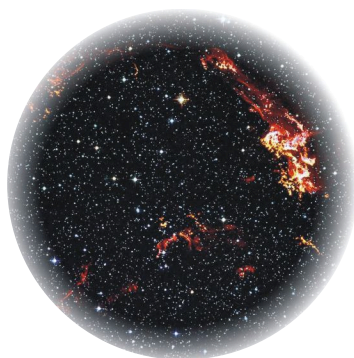

Celebrating: 2009 – The Year of Astronomy

The theme of this multimedia concert is the search for the "Lost Chord" as a musical metaphor for the pursuit of a unified "Theory of Everything" in science. The pipe organ, with its rows of pipes, suggests the telescopes and particle accelerators of modern physicists as it tells the story of humanity's quest for physical understanding in a program of just over an hour. The concert takes place in darkness, with footage from the Hubble Space Telescope projected continuously on a screen. Propelled through space and time by the organ music, the audience is encouraged to let their minds drift in contemplation of the human need for truth, beauty and meaning in a vast and baffling universe.
